



We consider Artifacts to be photos, documents, and videos that pertain to various objects. In the screen shot above the object is an animal, and a specific one, Casper. The photo in the top-right corner is considered an artifact.

Artifacts can be saved that are pertinent to Animals, PCOs, Events, and your Organization/Rescue. They give you a way to store a history of your rescue. The title of the screen, in this case Animal Artifacts, will change if you are entering an artifact for a different object (PCO, Event, or Rescue).

This screen shows you all the artifacts (photos, documents, and videos) that have been entered concerning the animal. The  button takes you to a screen where you can add a new artifact. The  button takes you to the details of an artifact shown in the list once it is selected.

Some have questioned calling these ‘artifacts’. They say it makes them think they are going on an archaeological dig in Peru. (Hey, that would be fun!). But no, unfortunately we are not going digging in Peru; we must stay here and help our animals. We needed a term that would cover photos, documents, and videos and artifacts came to mind. We like it so hopefully you’ll bear with us on this choice of terminology.

Important Note – Artifact screen responses are slower than for other screens. You must be patient. It takes longer to load images and documents than it does to load plain text. So, after clicking any button related to artifacts please give the app a little longer to respond. No response should take longer than 15 seconds and most will be much less.
